Green Fee Program

The UT Austin Green Fee Program is a competitive grant program funded by tuition fee to support sustainability related projects and initiatives proposed by university students, faculty or staff. The Green Fee is \$5.00 per long semester per student and \$2.50 for the summer session.

Green Fee Committee

A student majority Green Fee Committee solicits and reviews proposals and awards the funds. Green Fee Committee responsibilities include the following:

- Fall Semester: Attend monthly meetings to review and recommend changes or updates to program guidelines, application materials and scoring criteria
- Spring Semester:
 - January Participate in workshops offered to interested applicants (not mandatory)
 - February Attend one meeting to review and discuss grant amendment requests from previously funded projects
 - o March Review grant applications associated with current funding cycle
 - o April Attend weekly meetings to review and discuss grant applications
 - o May Attend at least two meetings to finalize funding decisions

Green Fee Program Fun Facts

As of June 2015, 115 students have been employed in 63 on-campus jobs created or supplemented by the Green Fee. Several hundred volunteers have participated in various one-time and ongoing green fee projects. As of December 2015, 102 projects received 133 grants. Sixty-one projects (60%) were proposed by students; 26 projects (25%) by staff; and 15 projects (15%) by faculty.
